Twelve cases narrated by Dr Watson, each one opening with a visitor at 221B Baker Street carrying an unusual problem. Conan Doyle keeps the plots crisp and the clues visible, so you can follow Holmes's reasoning step by step. The vocabulary is nineteenth-century British but never obscure, and Watson's calm, clear voice makes it easy to stay with the story even when the mystery deepens.

## What you'll practise

- Past simple and past perfect for recounting events and backstory
- Deductive phrases: 'It is clear that...', 'I observe...', 'The conclusion must be...'
- Victorian professional vocabulary: solicitors, constables, telegrams, hansom cabs
- Read along as each line is highlighted so you can follow Watson's narration at your own pace
