Sherlock Holmes and Dr Watson travel to the misty moorland of Devonshire to investigate a curse that may have killed the Baskerville family for generations. Conan Doyle builds tension gradually, so you have time to follow the clues alongside Watson. The vocabulary leans on atmosphere and deduction, and Holmes speaks in clear, precise English that rewards close reading.

What you'll practise

- Past perfect to explain backstory (had been found, had escaped)
- Language of deduction and reasoning (it follows that, I conclude)
- Descriptive landscape and weather vocabulary from the Devon moors
- Tap any Victorian legal or detective term to see its meaning
