by Niccolò Machiavelli · Best for B1–B2 (Intermediate–Upper intermediate)

Machiavelli wrote this short political treatise in 1513 as direct, practical advice to rulers, and in a good modern English translation it reads with surprising clarity. Each chapter poses a question about power and answers it with historical examples. The sentences are short and argumentative, which makes the logic easy to follow even if some vocabulary around politics, warfare, and statecraft is new to you.

## What you'll practise

- Conditional structures used to argue cause and effect: 'if a prince does X, then Y'
- Vocabulary of governance, strategy, and political relations
- Discursive connectors used to build an argument: however, on the contrary, therefore
- Tap any political or historical term to see its meaning without losing your place
