Stevenson's short thriller unfolds through several different narrators — a lawyer, a doctor, and finally Jekyll himself — each adding a new layer to the mystery. The writing is tighter and more direct than much Victorian fiction, which makes it a manageable stretch at this level. You will encounter formal legal and scientific language alongside vivid descriptions of foggy London streets, and the plot moves quickly enough to keep you turning pages.

What you'll practise

- Shifting narrative perspective as different characters tell their version of events
- Formal Victorian vocabulary in legal documents and personal testimonies
- Past perfect used to recount events that happened before the main story
- Tap any legal or scientific term to see its meaning and stay inside the story
